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#### **THE RULE SHOULD BE AMENDED TO READ**

##### **2 2 QUALIFICATIONS HEATS**

a. Heats shall contain a maximum of 12 drivers, ***this limit can be upgraded to 15 drivers by decision made between Race Director and the Referees of the race***

**Remark:** If track facilities are able to hold without problems more than 12 drivers we may have the chance to use the possibility.  
At practice we can check if track facilities are able to hold such amount of cars at the track, not only looking into track but rostrum, pit lane and even timetable  
Limit is still settled, 12 but there is a chance for upgrading it

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**THIS RULE IS NEW**

**2 QUALIFICATIONS HEATS**

*If the host country wants to, and the facilities can accommodate 180 drivers, qualifying rounds can be up to 15 cars, and all finals can be of 12 cars with 4 cars progressing to next final, and 6 cars from each semi final proceeding to Main A Final*

**Remark:** To accommodate 180 drivers and to reduce overall timetable.  
The number of entries must be agreed at the AGM

**2.5 All finals can be of 12 cars with 4 cars progressing to next final, and 6 cars from each semi final proceeding to Main A Final.**

*... / ...The top 3/4 from each up to the quarter Finals progressing to the next sub-final and the first 5/6 from each semi-final progressing to the Main Final.*

**Remark:** Actually rule state a HIGH minimum number without maximum, and with no rules for situation Where the minimum is not reached as we have experienced this year at Euros A  
The rule is also suitable for the Euros B, with the proportional scheme of counting rounds

**Out of 1 and 2 completed rounds 1 to count**

**Remark:** With this pattern the % of rounds to count are always 50% or Higher

**3 RACE PROCEDURES**

**Parc Ferme: Cars of the five fastest drivers in the first semi-final will be impounded in Parc ferme during the later semi-final**

**Remark:** This is to provide equal opportunity for drivers to prepare for the final. With current rule drivers of the later semi-final have only limited time to prepare for the all important Main Final, where as the drivers of the first semi-final have ample time even to completely rebuild their cars. This addition could be placed after 'delayed start' sentence in rule no 3

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**THIS RULE SHOULD BEAMENDED TO READ**

3 RACE PROCEDURES

- .2 Unless hosting club does **not** provide Marshals, Marshalling during practice and qualifying is done by the drivers, ~~(only drivers participating must marshal due to insurance implications)~~ who would marshal the race after their own and so on. For finals ~~large teams provide the most number of marshals, maximum 2, smaller teams 1 and very small teams none. (but may volunteer to help). The marshal on designated points marked by their country names, Team managers to insure that these points are covered at all times by drivers.~~

Substituting the last paragraph by the following one:

**For finals each driver will furnish the marshal for the marshalling point of his starting number, if the marshal is not present the car is not allowed to start his race until the point is covered by his/her marshal.**

**Remark:**

The first deletion is to make sense to the rule, actually it has no sense.

The second deletion is due to not being necessary mention nor true, at least in our country insurance, maybe in other ones yes, but it is not really necessary to write it, it is already stated that marshalling is done by THE DRIVERS, the reason has no influence in this circumstance, it has to be done by them whatever the reason is.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> deletion is an amendment, substituting the system by a different one.

Large races use this system without any problems, it is easy to police and quite reasonable, if you are to drive you are to provide a marshal, it is not necessary that he/she has to be from your country, but you have to provide it. Now system is unfair to large teams, unfair to team managers giving them real headaches and creating in some circumstances bad ambience inside their teams.

Even more the written system is not followed, i.e. places were not marked by their country names.

A similar system as the proposed one has been in use at large events with over 160 drivers, i.e. Indoor Holland, with absolutely no incidences.
